

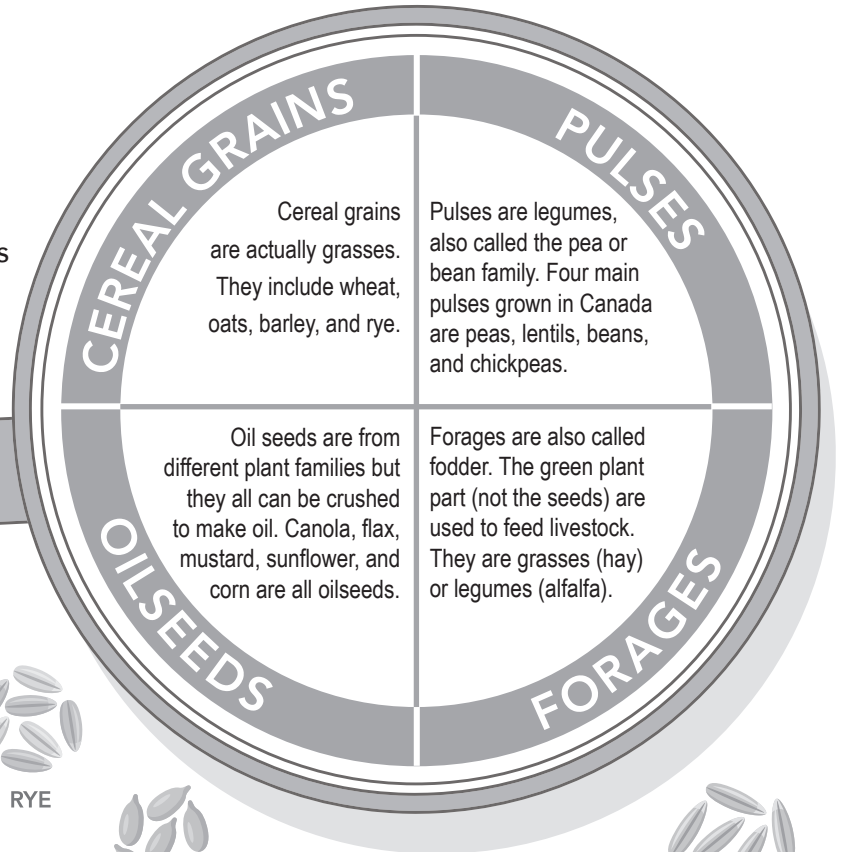
EXPLORE FIELD CROPS



What is the definition of a field crop?

A field crop is a plant that is:

- Planted on purpose and in an orderly way — it doesn't grow randomly or in the wild
- Grown on a large scale — in an area that is much larger than a garden or a patch
- Harvested and used by humans — it is often, but not always, to be eaten

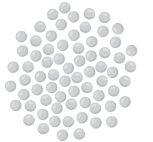
